Use of Force Data Collection

Introduction

What are the benefits

- Transparency - data guides the narrative
- Creates a clear picture of UoF across the nation
- Need for uniform collection of information
- RSMo 590.1265 - Police Use of Force Transparency Act of 2021
- Approved by the CJIS Advisory Board
- Endorsed by IACP and NSA
 - Per the FBI, this data will not “allow for the final disposition or adjudication of a use of force incident”

Requirements

- All Law Enforcement Agencies in the State of Missouri “any public agency that employs law enforcement personnel” defined by RSMo 590.1040
 - All local, county, and state law enforcement officers (such as municipal, county police officers, constables, state police, highway patrol, sheriffs, their deputies, etc.)
- Private Security, Probation and Parole, Corrections/Detention Officers, Juvenile Officers are excluded
- Any “Peace Officer” as defined by RSMo 590.010
 - RSMo 590.010 “Peace Officer” definition: a law enforcement officer of the state or any political subdivision of the state with the power of arrest for violation of criminal code or declared or deemed to be a peace officer by state statute
- Involved in an “Use of Force Incident” defined by RSMo 590.1265 as:
 - Reported to the FBI National Use of Force Data Collection using the
 - “standards and procedures governing the collection and reporting”
 - “consistent with the requirements, definitions, and methods of the National Use of Force Data Collection administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigations.”

What Qualifies as an Incident?

- UoF Incident defined as:
 - A fatality occurs that is connected to the use of force by a peace officer
 - Serious bodily injury occurs that is connected to the use of force by a peace officer; or
 - In the absence of death or serious physical injury, a peace officer discharges a firearm at, or in the direction of, a person

Reporting/Publication

- Who owns the data?
 - The agency owns the data
 - MSHP merely serves as a conduit of information
 - The agency will be able to update data
- Per the FBI:
 - No personally identifiable information about those involved will be released other than what is required
 - They will create “sanitized” data to ensure that the data cannot be linked back to specific individuals
 - Only release limited geographic details while redacting obvious identifiers
- DPS reporting
 - DPS will publish first report on March 1st, 2023
 - DPS reports will meet the following standards
 - including statewide aggregate data and agency-specific data, in a publicly available report on DPS’s website
 - Such data shall be deemed a public record consistent with the provisions and exemptions contained in [chapter 610](#).
 - DPS shall undertake an analysis of any trends and disparities in rates of use of force by all law enforcement agencies
 - A report to be released to the public no later than June 30, 2025
 - The report shall be updated periodically thereafter, but not less than once every five years
 - Law enforcement agencies shall not include personally identifying information of individual peace officers in their reports
- The FBI plans on using statistical tables along with:
 - Emphasis on visual data representation
 - Caveats about the use of data
 - And methodology of gathering data
- The FBI will have three levels of data
 - State level
 - Region level
 - National level
 - Nothing will be published at the agency level
- The FBI is already publishing UoF data that it has on file
 - Contributing agencies until 60% threshold is met
- Published on the FBI’S Crime Data Explorer (CDE)
 - The CDE may be updated quarterly
 - Data published on FBI’S CDE after reaching 60% participation
 - % type of UoF incident
 - % type of initial contact
 - Top five types of resistance
 - Top five types of force used
 - At 80% participation they will start releasing more information to include number of types at each level (state, region, national) but NOT agency

How to get Access

- Selection of POC
 - This POC will be someone at the agency that will be responsible for the submission of UoF data
 - Does not have to be the person who submits MIBRS data

Registration Process

- User Access Request
 - Any user needing access to the Use of Force Data Collection must submit a completed UCR Access Request Form SHP-146
 - Available on showmecrime.mo.gov under the Registration tab
 - Mark the appropriate type of access:
 - Use of Force
 - MIBRS
 - MIBRS & Use of Force
 - Approval signature from the agency head must be included along with user information
 - Submit completed SHP-146 via encrypted email or fax as indicated at the top of the form
 - The UCR Unit will email the user indicating receipt of request
 - Once access is established, the user will be notified at the email address provided on the form
 - Any questions regarding access should be directed to your Troop UCR Senior Program Specialist
- Modifying an existing user should be completed by submitting a new SHP-146
- To delete a user, submit a request by email to your Troop UCR Senior Program Specialist

When did submissions begin?

- RSMo 590.1265 required collection to begin 03/01/2022
 - Due by 10th of the month
 - Same time frame as MIBRS
 - Transmitted to the FBI on the 15th
- Use Show Me Crime webpage (www.showmecrime.mo.gov) to access link for creating submissions which will be demonstrated later
- Even if nothing to report, a zero report will be submitted for each month
- The Use of Force report does not take the place of any federal or state death in custody reports
 - Those still need to be submitted separately

Qualifying Incident Definitions

- **“Use of Force Incident”** defined by RSMo 590.1265 as:
 - A fatality occurs that is connected to the use of force by a peace officer
 - Serious bodily injury occurs that is connected to the use of force by a peace officer; or

- In the absence of death or serious physical injury, a peace officer discharges a firearm at, or in the direction of, a person

➤ **Serious Bodily Injury**

- RSMo 590.1265 refers to RSMo 556.061 to define as: physical injury that creates a substantial risk of death or that causes serious disfigurement or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any part of the body
- The FBI defines it as serious bodily injury based, in part, upon Title 18 United States Code (U.S.C), Section 2246 (4), and means bodily injury that involves a substantial risk of death, unconsciousness, protracted and obvious disfigurement, or protracted loss or impairment of the function of a bodily member, organ, or mental faculty. Serious bodily injury would include all gunshot wounds (regardless of whether they are penetrating or grazing), apparent broken bones, possible internal injury, severe laceration, stitches, sutures, chipped teeth, loss of teeth, canine bites requiring medical attention, unconsciousness due to an applied carotid artery hold, and injuries severe enough to require medical intervention and/or hospitalization. The term "medical intervention" **does not** include routine evaluation of the subject to determine fitness for arrest or detention by an emergency medical technician or medical staff at a medical facility

➤ **Firearm**

- The definition of firearm is based on the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives definition, 18 U.S. 921 (a) (3): The term firearm means:
- any weapon (including a starter gun) which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive; the frame or receiver of any such weapon; any firearm muffler or firearm silencer; or any destructive device. Firearms discharged at or in the direction of a person with less lethal munitions, such as beanbags, pepper balls, and rubber bullets are **excluded**. In addition, electronic control weapons are **not** to be considered firearms.

RMS File Submission

➤ Located on Crime Insight Home page

- On the Submission page, select "Use of Force Upload"
- Submit the file by selecting the file
- Submitting from RMS generated file
 - File will upload and be validated for errors or warnings
 - If errors, correct and resubmit the incident(s)
 - If warnings, review the warning data to ensure that it is accurate
 - If not accurate, correct and resubmit
 - If accurate, notify your Troop UCR Senior Program Specialist to remove the warning

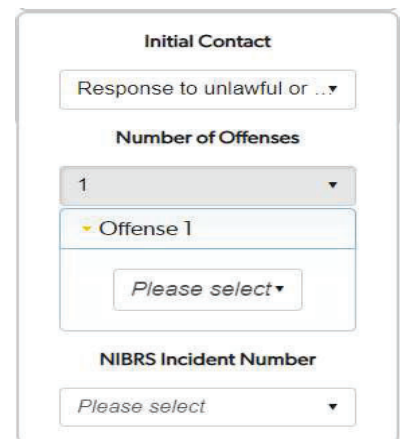

- “Pending” cannot be submitted with a “known” data element
- Incident Date
- Incident Time
- Location Type
 - Pick most accurate location; based off of MIBRS location definitions
 - Other, pending investigation and Unknown are also options
- Ambushed
- Did Officers Approach
- Senior Officer Present
 - Senior Officer is a supervisory or senior officer who is of higher rank, in charge of the scene (at the time of the UoF), or in charge of the officer involved in the force
 - Answer “yes” if “senior officer” was contacted or on scene during use of force
 - Does not refer to an officer who has more experience and is not in a supervisory role
- Total Officers Status
 - Pending investigation, Unknown or Known
 - Only required if pending or unknown
- Total Officers Involved
 - Indicate the total number of officers involved that **actually applied force**
- Subjects Status
 - Pending investigation, Unknown or Known
 - Only required if pending or unknown
- Agency Officer Status
 - Indicate if the number of officers from your agency that actually applied force
 - Pending investigation, Unknown or Known
 - Only required if pending or unknown
- Incident Ticklers
 - Select qualifying event
 - Can select more than one if applicable
- Initial Contact
- Select most appropriate
 - Response to Unlawful or Suspicious Activity will require:
 - Number of Offenses
 - Each offense will require:
 - Number of NIBRS Offense
 - NIBRS Offense(S)
 - NIBRS Incident Number
- Other Agencies Involved
 - Will require
 - Other Agency ORI
 - Other Agency Case Number
 - If case number is not known use UNKNOWN00

- Officer information does not allow ranges; it is assumed this information can be obtained from agency records
 - If unable to attain at time of entry, select pending and update when information becomes available
 - Each officer involved will require the same data
- Age of Officer
 - Height of Officer
 - Weight of Officer
 - Race of Officer
 - Gender of Officer
 - Officer's year of service
 - Full or Part Time
 - Officer Identifiable

- Used to designate if officer was readily identifiable as an officer during incident
 - On Duty
 - Injured
 - Yes, it will require an Injury Type
 - Known will require a selection of types
 - Agency can select more than one option
 - NIBRS Incident Number, if known
 - Shots Fired
- Verify information then SUBMIT
 - Once submitted it will take you to UoF Data Upload page
 - Will show pending then change to completed once processed
 - Errors and warnings will show once the report has been completed
 - Click to view
 - See instructions for editing to update and correct errors

Deleting an Incident

- Enter ORI
- Enter Case Number
- Select Delete
 - Pop-up will ask for confirmation
 - Once confirmed with Yes, system will ask for Incident date
 - Enter Incident date then submit
 - Will take you to UoF Data Upload page
 - Will show pending then change to completed once deletion processed

Editing an Incident

- Enter ORI
- Enter Case Number
 - Incident will populate
 - In red box at the top of screen, it will show Validation Errors
- Make corrections as needed then submit
- Will take you to UoF Data Upload page
 - Will show pending then change to completed once processed
 - Errors and warnings will show once the incident has been completed
 - Click to view

Zero Report

- Used to submit a report indicating there were no qualifying UoF incidents for the month
 - Do not report until the month has ended
- Log in to the MSHP Crime Insight Repository (showmecrime.mo.gov)
- Select 'Web Entry' and the dropdown 'Use of Force'

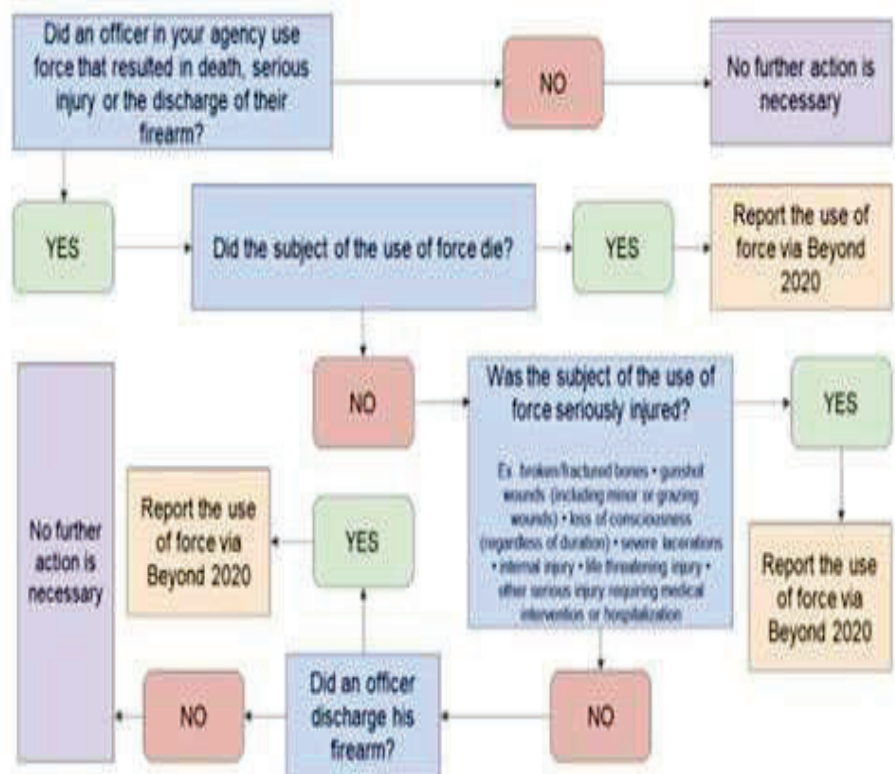

- Enter ORI

 - Confirmation box will appear
 - Click Submit will remove a previously submitted Zero report for that month

 - Unit/officer-initiated contacts
 - Court bailiff activities
- At this time, the State of Missouri will not be requiring agencies submit this data
 - Agencies can submit directly to the FBI through LEEP, if they choose to

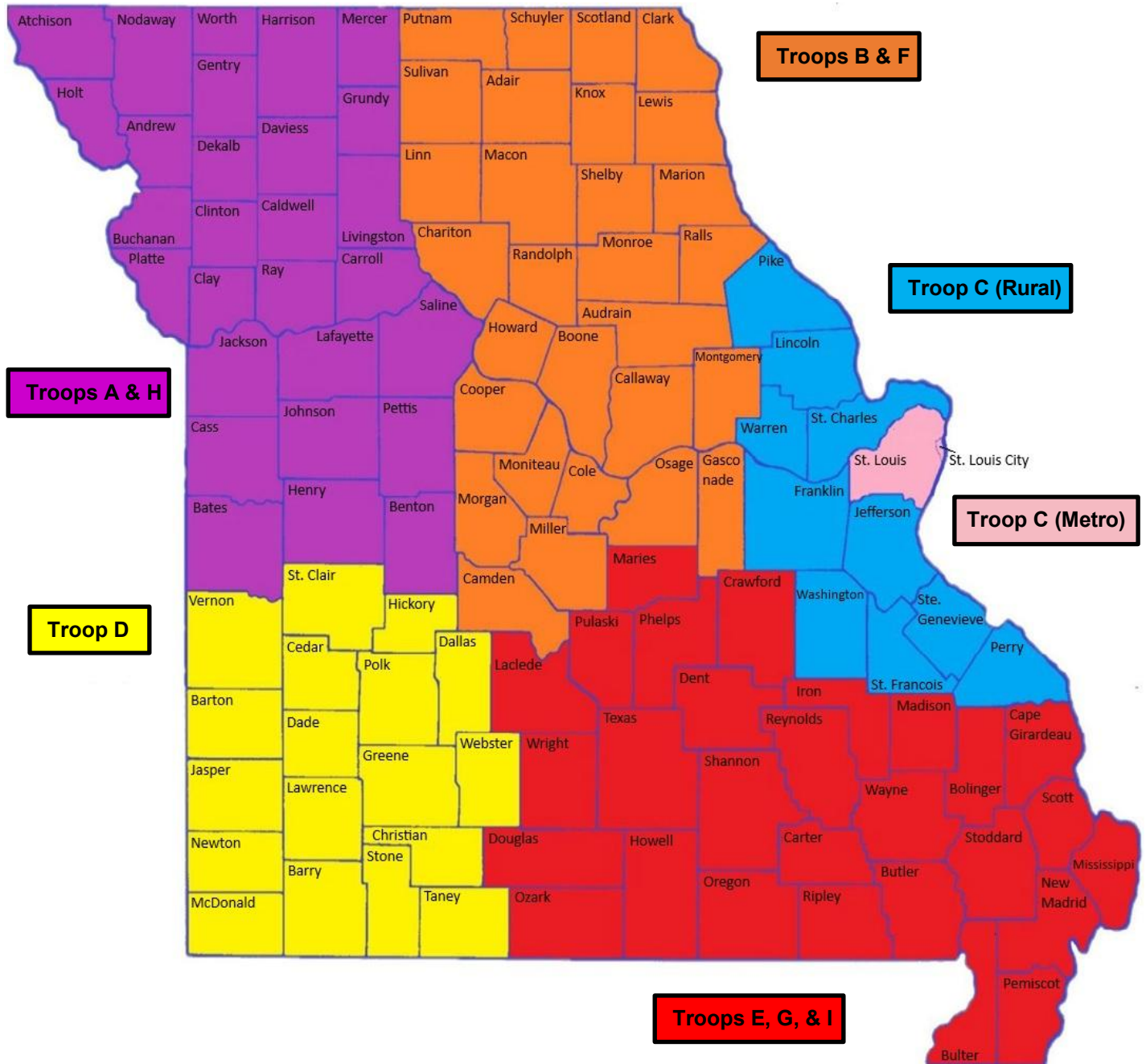
